Position Overview:

The College of Education at Boise State University seeks candidates for an assistant/associate research professor to collaborate with a local service provider. The incumbent will manage and lead all aspects of a research agenda, including single case design studies, quasi-experimental studies for school-based work, and other research approaches as dictated by the research questions.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

The incumbent's primary duty will be to plan, design, implement and manage rigorous applied research and evaluation studies

- Identify organizational evaluation needs and develop methodological plans to execute on these evaluations
- Work with service providers to support the alignment of processes and tools to facilitate data collection and continuous improvement
- Identify, develop and manage partnerships with faculty or other potential research partners
- Collaborate in developing scientifically rigorous applied research and evaluation funding proposals
- Collaborate in writing research reports for sponsoring agencies, conference presentations and publications for peer-reviewed journals

In addition to conducting research, the incumbent will manage and supervise the research team and is expected to effectively communicate the research agenda to a variety of audiences.

The approximate expected division of labor is 50% research, 30% management/supervision, and 20% communication.

Required Educational Qualifications:

- Ph.D. in special education, or clinical, social or developmental psychology, or related field.
- A minimum of two years postdoctoral or equivalent research experience.

Required Technical Qualifications:

- Advanced knowledge in translating research into intervention programming.
- Advanced knowledge and experience with evaluation research methodologies, database management, measurement and data analysis. Expertise in single case design, randomized control trials and quasi-experimental designs highly preferred.
- Experience translating research and designing and conducting applied research and program evaluation.
- Experience effectively supervising/ managing staff.
- Strong technical writing and communication skills.
- A publication record in peer-reviewed journals.
- Proven track record of obtaining external funding for research and evaluation projects.
- Ability to develop expertise in new issue areas quickly.
- Experience developing relationships and partnerships with other organizations.
- Excellent computer skills are required: Microsoft Office programs, SPSS, HLM, AMOS and other databases.
