

Call for Applications: Editor(s), *Learning Disability Quarterly* (LDQ)

Dr. Diane P. Bryant's editorship of *Learning Disability Quarterly* (LDQ) will be ending on September 30, 2026. In preparation, the Hammill Institute on Disabilities is opening a call for applications for editor(s) of the journal. The chosen candidate(s) will serve a 3-year term (plus approximately six additional months for revisions at the end of the term). Responsibilities include appointing an editorial review board, selecting manuscript reviewers, accepting articles for publication, and ensuring production timelines are met. The incoming editor(s) will be appointed by the Hammill Institute on Disabilities and will assume journal operations on October 1, 2026.

Applications Must Be Received by **August 1, 2026**.

Learning Disability Quarterly (LDQ) is published quarterly by the Hammill Institute on Disabilities and Sage in association with the Council for Learning Disabilities, and features high-quality research and scholarship concerning children, youth, and adults with learning disabilities. Consistent with that purpose, the journal seeks to publish articles with the potential to impact and improve educational outcomes, opportunities, and services. In 2025, JCR ranked LDQ 17 out of 62 journals in Special Education. The journal receives more than 100 article submissions annually, and in 2025 had an acceptance rate of 4.3% and an Impact Factor of 1.9.

Applicants must be scholars with an outstanding record relevant to a wide knowledge of interdisciplinary research and evidence-based practice related to individuals with learning disabilities. Additionally, applicants should be active contributors to professional literature; have experience editing and reviewing professional publications; and be able to work cooperatively with the LDQ editorial board, authors, and the publisher.
